

<p><b><u>English</u></b>          In English we will be studying non-fiction texts about animals to link with our topic work.          They will study the book, "How to Wash a Woolley Mammoth" to learn about instructions, including bossy verbs and sequencing steps. They will use their learning to write their own set of instructions on how to wash their own chosen animal.          We will also learn about lists, labels and facts using the book, "One Little Chick". The children will identify key features of each and use this to write their own labels and lists.</p>	<p><b><u>Maths</u></b>          In Maths we will be developing our understanding of multiplication by counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We will identify patterns with each and using this to recognise numbers that will appear in each. The children will learn to count forwards and backwards.          The children will also develop their understanding of how to measure length. They will understand the terms 'longer' and 'shorter' and use non-standard and standard units to measure objects from the classroom.</p>	<p><b><u>Science</u></b>          Our topic for this term is animals so the children will deepen their understanding of how animals live. They will learn about different habitats and how animals adapt to live in each habitat (e.g. the desert compared to the Arctic).</p>
<p><b><u>PSHE/RSE –</u></b>          This term the children will learn about staying healthy.          They will identify healthy food and learn about the five food groups. They will deepen their understanding of which foods belong in each food group and how this helps our bodies.          They will engage in discussions about different medicines and how we use medicines to feel better. They will consider the difference between each and how they must be looked after to ensure survival.          The children will deepen their understanding of animals and their offspring, recognising that some offspring do not look like their adult.          When learning about pets, the children will identify things each animal type needs and how it differs depending on the animal.</p>
	<p><b><u>Art/DI</u></b>          In Art this term the children will learn about the elements of drawing. The children will explore patterns and lines using different materials such as crayons, felt tips, pastels and chalk. They will gain inspiration from the wildlife photographer Shannon Wild.</p>
